WELCOME TO FRAIM

The ICTV board and staff acknowledge and thank the Arrente people for allowing us to hold the Festival of Remote Australian Indigenous Moving-Image (FRAIM) on their beautiful lands here in Alice Springs— Mparntwe.

We welcome all delegates, trainers and mentors attending and thank you for travelling the immense distances across remote Australia, from the north, the centre, and from east to west, to be here this week.

This is the second time that FRAIM has been run by ICTV as a biannual event in Alice Springs. The idea of running a dedicated video festival has its roots in the very first remote 'film' festival which was held in Walungurru (Kintore) in 1998. As the Indigenous media sector in remote Australia has evolved and grown, the ICTV board identified the need for a new dedicated event to support all those who contribute videos to ICTV. Where would be without you?

The ICTV television service relies almost entirely on voluntary contributions from organisations like PAKAM and the many video-makers living in remote communities who are producing content by themselves or as part of youth programs, art centres, schools, language centres, radio stations, ranger programs and more. FRAIM has been developed to support and celebrate this broad contributor group and to create a framework on which to build a stronger and more viable sector. It combines workshops, forums, screenings and the ICTV Video Awards (which ICTV ran from 2010 to 2016 as part of the Remote Media Festival). The awards present an opportunity to give back to our contributor groups by acknowledging your efforts in strengthening culture and language, and in affirming the viability of Indigenous lives in remote Australia.

Our hope is that this second FRAIM not only strengthens the networks of Indigenous video-makers working in remote areas of Australia, but also inspires those same video-makers to return to their communities to create inspiring content.

We usually only get to speak to you by phone or via email, so it is always great to see you all here in person. We hope you enjoy your week with us.

ICTV would also like to thank and acknowledge the state, territory and federal governments along with the many other supporters and partners who have made FRAIM possible.

FRAIM WORKSHOPS

WORKSHOP 1 CREATING COMEDY

Got a funny story you want to share? Love to laugh? The Creating Comedy Workshop looks at the elements required to tell and produce a humorous story for screen with a focus on content—the creation, performance and direction of comedy. This workshop will look at comedy in our everyday lives and will require feeling comfortable to speak in small groups and work in small teams. You don't need to understand how to shoot the story (technical skills), but a basic understanding of framing shots would be useful in understanding the production process.

Tamara Whyte

Tamara Whyte works across film/video, photography and photomedia. She has shot, written, directed and produced a number of short



documentaries, drama and video works since 2010 and has been screened and exhibited both nationally and internationally. Her photomedia work is held in private collections. A descendant of the Warrgamay peoples of coastal far north Queensland, she has completed tertiary studies in Drama, Screen and Media and has a Masters in Indigenous Social Policy. In 2020, she was the recipient of the Inaugural Centralised Documentary

Australia Foundation Fellowship.

WORKSHOP 2 PRODUCING NEWS & MICRODOCUMENTARIES IN LANGUAGE

This workshop supports participants to plan, research, produce, edit and translate either a news story, a current affairs story or a microdocumentary. The planning and research sessions are classroom-based. while later sessions support participants to record a story and to locate B-roll material and cutaways. The final sessions are focused on post-production including translation, back translation and subtitling. Production assistance will be available for participants who do not have editing experience. It is open to non-language speakers, however stories written in English will be translated into language. Content will be drawn from both ICTV workshops and what is happening in Alice Springs.

Tony Collins

Tony Collins who has worked as a journalist and broadcaster for over 30 years in community radio and television as well as ABC Radio and TV. He is an experienced news



reporter and documentary maker and has worked with many Indigenous broadcasters in remote communities and in urban centres producing programs in English as well as a range of Indigenous languages. He is based in Alice Springs where he has produced several news stories for ICTV in Arrente language with Arrente production teams.

MEET THE TRAINERS

WORKSHOP 3 PRODUCING SEQUENTIAL EVENTS

This practical videography workshop will cover what is required to get the correct coverage of a live event, such as an awards night or football game, and a sequential structured recording like a cooking show in a studio or on location. It will cover working with a single camera set up, how to work collaboratively as a team in a multicamera situation, how to work in a live-to-air recording environment, and the difference between a live vision mix and shooting for an editor. Content for this workshop will be a cooking demonstration by local celebratory bushfoods expert. Rayleen Brown and students from St Joseph's Flexible Learning Centre. There will be an opportunity for some delegates to participate in the live broadcast of the ICTV Video Awards.

Devris (Dev) Hasan is a Cinematographer / Filmmaker who has been working in the Australian film and television windustry for over 20 years. His strong affiliation



with the Arts has also led to his filming of performance art, theatre productions, exhibitions and music festivals, in addition to imparting knowledge as a visiting lecturer for over 17 years with institutions including NIDA, TAFE (WA), Film & Television Institute (WA), Metroscreen (NSW) and the Australian Film Television and Radio School (AFTRS).

WORKSHOP 4 DOCUMENTARY MASTERCLASS

Indigenous screen practitioners have been using film and video for many years to explore, challenge and present an Indigenous perspective to a wider audience. Stories of land rights, water rights, self-determination and repatriation feature strongly in ICTV programming. This documentary masterclass is a targeted workshop for contributors who have produced several documentaries for ICTV and would like to take their documentary film-making practice to the next level.

Pauline Clague is Associate Professor, Manager of Cultural Resilience Hub, Jumbunna Institute for Indigenous Education & Research at UTS. A Yaeql



woman from North Coast NSW, she has worked as a storyteller and producer in film and TV for 25 years. As an NSW Treasury endorsed Creative Specialist, Pauline helps independent filmmakers and other creative people to strengthen their financial sustainability. She was awarded the Stanley Hawes Award in 2015 for her contribution to Australian documentaries and is the 2020 Natalie Miller Fellow.

WORKSHOP 5 PRODUCING MUSIC VIDEOS

Working with Eastern Arrente Band with two mastered music tracks, this workshop will explore a range of options for producing music video clips. We will be capturing their best performance, building dramatic storylines through creative coverage and exploring the fun of in-camera and digital effects. Participants will leave this workshop with the ability to make their own video clips with a greater understanding of film language and the confidence to push boundaries.


